BYLAW 20-09

8. LITTERING

- (a) No Person shall place, deposit, throw, or cause to be placed, deposited, or thrown, any Litter, refuse, or other substance upon any street, lane, Sidewalk, parking lot, park, playground, or other Public Place or watercourse, or on Property not his own, except in a receptacle provided for such purposes.
- (b) A Person who has placed, deposited, or thrown, or caused to be placed, deposited, or thrown, any Litter upon any street, Lane, Sidewalk, parking place, park, playground or other Public Place or watercourse, or an any property not his own, shall forthwith remove it, or upon direction of the Property Owner, agent or lessee, or a Peace Officer.

The Village of Donnelly would like to remind ALL Residents that it is illegal to throw your litter away at the Public Works Department Yard. Currently, we have (1) one area to dispose of your yard waste such as leaves, tree trimmings, wood with NO NAILS/SCREWS, etc and (1) one Metal bin for METAL ONLY.

It has come to our attention that Residents are using the Public Works Department Yard to dispose of their television, fridges, stoves, microwaves and other garbage and not using the Metal Bin for METAL ONLY.

The Village of Donnelly, effective immediately, will be monitoring each vehicle and/or person that enters the yard. If you are found disposing of your litter at the yard site, you will be referred to the Bylaw Officers and fines will be imposed as well as written notice forthwith to remove it from Village property.



Below is a list of items that CANNOT be dumped into the Metal ONLY Bin:

- Paint Cans
- Motor Oil Cans
- Pots/Pans
- Propane Gas Tanks
- Appliances (see picture above)
- Items that contain mercury
- Car & Truck Parts (such as drivetrain, flywheel, batteries, headlamps, sensors, etc
- Televisions and Computer Monitors
- Radioactive Metal
- Metals that contain uranium
- Old skidoos or motorcycles

If you are unsure if you may dump your metal, contact Public Works Department at 780-837-6036 to avoid fines and cost of removal.
